## Addendum to "how to knit on two circular needles"...

This is a cuff for top down socks, but it could just as well be a toe too, no difference.

**A- 1)** When you are ready to knit, your yarn strands will be at the back and to the right.

- 2) **Front needle** stitches are pulled to the **rightmost needle** ready to knit...
- 3) **...back needle stitches** pulled to cable and "resting".

Make sure your strands come out from the center of the socks and not wrapped around the needles. (See page 22.)



**B)** When you have **completed** knitting across the rightmost sock, your yarn tail will now be at the **front**, or closest to you needle. *That yarn tail front position is an indicator to you that you have completed knitting that sock.*

You have **not** knitted the **left** sock yet, so the yarn tail of that sock will still be at the **back / right**.

So if you pick up your work with a partial round knitted, you will be able to tell where you are if you look at your yarn tails.



**C-1)** Now you are done knitting **BOTH** socks, and **BOTH yarn tails** are now at the **front / left**.

2) You are ready to turn the socks so you can knit the opposite side.

I think you will begin to realize that the positions of the yarn tails play an important role in knitting two socks at the same time on two circular needles.

**D-1)** Here are your socks turned, (*bottom of page 21*) and ready to begin to knit front-most needle again...

- 2) Once again the **front needle** stitches are pulled to the **rightmost needle** ready to knit...
- 3) ... the **back needle stitches** pulled to **cable** and “resting”.
